Alternative care/Credits to Account

Unless a provider has a holiday clause Odyssey will set up alternative care for families when their provider closes. Parents can request credits to their accounts if they choose not to use alter-

nate care when their provider closes. This can only be applied if childcare has not been set up or if there has been 12 hour cancellation notice to the alternate provider and the agency. A credit

cannot be administered if your provider has a holiday clause. Please inquire with your provider if you are unsure if your provider has one.

Checks will not be written to parents for credits on the account. Credits will not be applied to the account if it is the last month of care for a family. Please contact office with any questions.

Notifying Families of Incidents

WHEN A CHILD IS INJURED AT THE DAY HOME, NO MATTER WHAT THE INJURY IS THE PARENTS WILL BE NOTIFIED OF THE INJURY WHEN IT HAPPENS. IN SOME CASES THE PARENTS MAY NEED TO COME TO THE DAY HOME TO ASSESS THE INJURY THEMSELVES. THIS WILL BE TO DE-

TERMINE IF THEY NEED TO GO HOME OR TO THE DOCTOR. IF WE CANNOT GET A HOLD OF A PARENT WE WILL TRY THE EMERGENCY CONTACT IF THE SITUATION WARRANTS IT. PLEASE CONTACT THE OFFICE IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS IN REGARD TO THIS. IT IS PART OF OUR POLICIES THAT THIS WILL HAPPEN.
