Discussing Dinosaurs

1. Tell your children that you are going to be talking and learning about dinosaurs.
2. Ask them what they know about dinosaurs and make a list on a large sheet of paper.
3. Do the same on the last day; you will be surprised at how much they have learned.
4. Have the children draw a dinosaur, keep them and do the same on the last day of the unit. See how much their drawings have changed. **Target: peer interactions**

Target: Cause and effect

Dinosaur defence

Spend some time learning about different kinds of dinosaurs and how they differ from one another. Discuss how various dinosaurs defend themselves. Children can look at pictures of dinosaurs and shared how they thought that dinosaur would protect itself from a predator. The Ankylosaurus has a clubbed tail that it uses for defence. To help the children understand how a club at the end of the tail would give the dinosaur more power each child build a Lego tower of at least 5 blocks. Then each child got a straw and we tried to knock over the blocks using the straw. (We did gentle taps with the wrist, not big swings with the arms). Then children added a small amount of play dough to the end of the straw, about the size of a medium bouncy ball. They then tried again to knock over the tower of blocks and found that with the “club” at the end of the tail like the Ankylosaurus they had a very powerful swing.

Target: comparing

Dino egg matching game

You will need 10-12 large plastic eggs (Dollar store) for this game and 2 each of 5-6 different kinds of dinosaur stickers.

Place the stickers on to the outside of the eggs

Have the children find the matching sets of dinosaur eggs

Variation: Purchase sets of 5-6 different kinds of small dinosaur figures. Place the figures inside the eggs. Have the children open the eggs to find the matching dinosaurs.

Variation: Hide the eggs around the room first for the children to find then have them find the matching dinosaurs.
