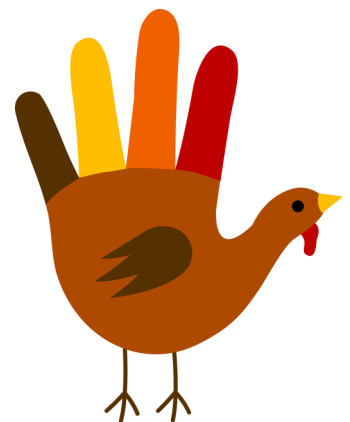

Tarantula Treats

There's nothing like a nice crunchy platter of tarantulas after a long day of ghost busting. Eat them quickly before they crawl away!

- 1 cup (250 ml) chocolate chips
- 1 cup (250 ml) chow mein noodles
- 1 cup (250 ml) finely shredded coconut

Melt the chocolate chip – in a heavy saucepan over low heat, or in the microwave, on high power for 1 ½ to 2 minutes. Stir until smooth. Dump in the noodles and the

coconut and toss the mixture together until everything is evenly coated with chocolate. Line a cookie sheet with waxed paper. Spoon out gobs of tarantula mixture onto the waxed paper and arrange the legs so they are sticking out properly. Take advantage of any available laboratory assistants to help in spider construction. It's a revolting job, but somebody has to do it. ***Refrigerate tarantulas until petrified

Making Crayons

Paraffin wax crayons—does not matter brand.

Preheat oven to 150°F Use an ungreased muffin, mini muffin tin or candy mold to make these crayons.

Parents: Use a butcher knife to chop of the old crayons into

pea-size pieces, taking care to keep the colors separate so you kids can combine the colors as they like.

Children: Fill the tin or molds with the crayon pieces, arranging them in different designs as desired.

Bake until the waxes have melted, approximately 15-20 minutes. Let the crayons cool and remove from tins/molds. If they stick in the tins, place tin in freezer for an hour and the crayons will pop out.
