POLICY CHANGES

We have a few changes in policies to inform the families on.

With the legalization of cannabis we have added this to our smoking and vaping policy.

Parents must give written permission for the use of video monitors to be used in the provider home. If your provider has one there will be a new media release form to be signed.

We will no longer be offering reimbursements on accounts when a provider closes. Of course alternate care is always offered when the providers close.

The new holiday clause forms are ready to be signed. Any provider with a clause will be asking each family to sign the new form and then it will be returned to Odyssey. One will be kept in the parent file

and one in the provider file. Please remember to ask any questions to the provider or the agency on the clause before signing it.

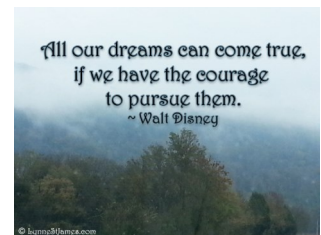

Standard 10C – Illness

If a provider notices that a child exhibits any of the signs or symptoms listed below, the provider must ensure that:

1. The child’s parent(s) arranges for the immediate removal of the child from the program premises; and
2. The child does not return to the

program premises until the providers is satisfied that the child no longer poses a health risk to others in the program (e.g. the parents provide a physician’s note, the parents declare that the child has been symptom free for at least 24 hours.)

Signs or symptoms of illness exhibited by a child include:

1. A child vomiting, having a fever, diarrhea or a new unexplained rash or cough.

2. A child requiring greater care and attention than can be provided without compromising the care of the other children in the program.

3. A child having or displaying any other illness or symptom the staff knows or believes may indicate that the child poses a health risk to persons on the program premises.
